Dear Parents and Carers,

A polite reminder:

The Faunce St Gate is **not** in use for bringing children to school or taking them home. It can only be used for Breakfast Club children from **8.00am – 8.45am**, or for visitors to the office from **9.00am – 3.15pm** and **3.45pm – 4.15pm**. We allow the 3 families who live in Faunce Street to use that gate and we have permission from the residents to do so. This is not a school rule, but a rule that is part of the planning restrictions agreed between Southwark Council and our neighbours and we all have to abide by it. A member of the leadership team will be on the Faunce St gate to help this run smoothly. Gaza St gate and Doddington gate are open from 8.45 – 9.10 a.m. and then at 3.15 – 3.45 p.m.

In our whole school assembly this week we marked Martin Luther King Day. The children learnt that in America it is a public holiday for children and council workers and it is marked by people doing random acts of kindness or volunteering to help in their communities for the day. The children reflected on the difference Martin Luther King made, his philosophy of non-violent protest and how they could mark his special day at school and at home, so I hope on you have had some extra help at home this week!

The leadership team have spent this week looking at pupil progress. Progress rates remain good and more children are catching up and exceeding their targets than this time last year. Thank you for all the support you give your child. For the children who haven't made enough progress to catch up, we have added some additional interventions to give some extra help. One of the barriers for a lot of this group of children is their poor attendance. Every day at school matters. If children aren't here, they can't learn. Attendance has improved so much, let's renew our determination to make it even better!

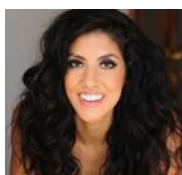
