Predicting	Inferring
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What do you think will happen next?</li><li>• What do you think will happen in the next chapter/page?</li><li>• Why do you think that?</li><li>• What evidence is there to suggest this?</li><li>• Were your predictions correct?</li><li>• How did you confirm your predictions?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What do you think is really happening here?</li><li>• Why do you say that?</li><li>• What does (this phrase) mean?</li><li>• Find the words/phrases that suggest that...</li><li>• What does the text tell us about this character/setting/ mood?</li><li>• What is the theme of this text/article?</li><li>• What is the writer's viewpoint? How do you know?</li><li>• What does the writer want you to think of this character/event?</li><li>• Why has the author chosen this title?</li><li>• Choose a character and say what they felt/thought/did in response to events. How do you know?</li></ul>
Clarifying	Organisation and Structure
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What strategies would you use when you get stuck on a word?</li><li>• What voice might the character use?</li><li>• How would the character say...?</li><li>• Were there any difficult parts you want to discuss?</li><li>• What could you do to better understand this?</li><li>• Which strategies did you use to work through the difficult parts?</li><li>• What is the purpose of the features of a non-fiction text?</li><li>• How will you find the information efficiently?</li><li>• What key information are you looking for?</li><li>• What type of question is this?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Why is the text arranged in this way?</li><li>• Does the layout and colour of the text have an impact on the reader?</li><li>• How does the author engage the reader and make you want to read on?</li><li>• How is the information organised? Why do you think this order/headings were chosen?</li><li>• Why do you think the author uses short sentences?</li><li>• What is the purpose of writing in bold/italics/boxes etc?</li><li>• How does each section begin? Why do you think this?</li><li>• How do the headings help when you scan the text?</li><li>• How does the author ensure cohesion? Which idea in this paragraph is linked to the next paragraph?</li><li>• How do short and longer sentences change the pace of the story?</li></ul>

Asking Questions	Evaluating
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are there any questions you want to ask to clarify, predict, infer, evaluate, summarise the meaning?</li> <li>• Are there any questions that you want to ask that aren't explained by the text?</li> </ul>	<p><b>Language</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Why did the author use such words/phrases?</li> <li>• What was the effect of that language/structure/ presentation on the whole text?</li> <li>• How does that improve the text?</li> <li>• Which was your favourite example of imagery within the poem and why?</li> <li>• Where has figurative language been used and what was the impact?</li> <li>• What will help you summarise this text e.g. a mind-map, story map, diagram, images?</li> <li>• What different types of language has the author uses?</li> <li>• Why has the author used this language in this part of the text?</li> <li>• How successful in this text in provoking an emotion?</li> <li>• What does...tell you about how the character is feeling?</li> </ul>
Summarising	Making connections
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What are the main events in the story so far?</li> <li>• Where does the story take place?</li> <li>• What is happening at the beginning/middle/end of the book?</li> <li>• Where did the character live?</li> <li>• What are the main ideas from this page/chapter/text?</li> <li>• What is the main idea/theme of this poem?</li> <li>• What are the main points made in this section of the text?</li> <li>• Can you give a direct quote from the text that proves that...?</li> </ul>	<p><b>Text to self:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How do you know this is a fairy story?</li> <li>• Which do you prefer; texts set in historical times or in modern times? Why?</li> <li>• Have you been in a similar situation to the character in this book?</li> <li>• Have you ever had a similar experience? How did your feelings affect how you acted?</li> </ul> <p><b>Text to text:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Does this remind you of another book/character/ setting?</li> <li>• How is this book similar and different to other books?</li> <li>• What might we expect to see in e.g. a myth?</li> <li>• Have you read any other books in this series by the same author?</li> <li>• What features make this book similar to?</li> </ul> <p><b>Text to world:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Would this text work in a different historical setting?</li> <li>• What do you know about this period in history which helps you understand the writer's meaning/purpose?</li> </ul>
