SAFEGUARDING – Years 2, 3 and 4



Now we have the luxury of more outside space we have a larger area to line up in, which is safer and more pleasant. PSHE PROJECT ON QUESTIONING STEREOTYPES

What is PSHE?



Personal, social and health education (PSHE) helps to give children the knowledge, skills and understanding they need to lead confident, healthy and independent lives. It aims to help them understand how they are developing personally and socially, tackling many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. Learning opportunities take place in specific lessons as well as in assemblies, circle time, special school projects and other activities that enrich pupils' experiences.

Questioning Stereotypes

Lauren, one of our Year 2 teachers leads on PSHE across the school. She is launching this whole school topic. You will read more about it as the year goes on. We need some help. We would like the children to learn about adults who have jobs that might have broken a stereotype of some kind. Do you (or do you know someone) who has a job where you are, or were in a minority – your gender, your ethnicity for example? We would love to talk to you. We would like to use your experience to share with children in lessons. If you are interested then please contact the office, or speak to Lauren in the playground. We want all our children to have open ideas about what they might do as adults that go beyond what they might hear and see in the media.
