Parent Reading Volunteers

We are drawing close to the final half term so it is time to get carnival ready! This year our theme is going to be Eco-carnival. We will be making props and instruments out of recycled plastic. To make this possible we are asking that you bring in **recycled plastic bottles, plastic bags and bottle lids.**

Please see examples of what we are looking for below:



Plastic bottles of any size or shape.

Plastic bags of any size or colour.

(These will be cut up so can be old/ have holes!)



Plastic lids of any size or colour.

There will be blue recycling bins in the playground from Monday 20th May for you to pop your items in. These will be out daily, before and after school, until further notice. Please use the half term to collect what you can!

Please ensure the bottles are clean and please avoid sending anything in that has contained nuts or fish - due to the allergies of some of our pupils. Remember to only bring recycled items that have been requested. Thank you!

Re - Term time absence.

As a school we have an exceptional circumstance policy when reviewing a request for term time absence.

Term time absence is discouraged as it can disrupt the learning of your child but we are aware that there may be a situation where it is unavoidable.

In these instances, we ask that parents complete the 'Application for Leave during Term Time' form, 2 weeks prior to the absence. From September 2019, this form will change and will be the 'Parent Request for Exceptional Leave Form' as produced by the Local Authority, again to be completed 2 weeks prior to the absence.

The Local Authority has also provided schools with guidance around what constitutes an exceptional circumstance and what does not. Copies of guidance will be placed on our school website.

For example, the Local Authority deem it an exceptional circumstance 'if a parent is service personnel and is returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future which coincides with school holidays.

The following is an example of what is **NOT** considered an exceptional circumstance -

- Holidays abroad for the purpose of visiting a sick relative, excepting where that person is seriously ill. Medical evidence may be requested.
- Holidays taken in term time due to lower cost/parental work commitments.

Where term time absence occurs and the absence has not been authorised, parents/carers remain at risk of being issued with a Penalty Notice.

As a school it is important for us to provide parents/carers with as much information as possible in order for the choices you make to be informed ones.

The school target for school attendance is **96%** and it is only with the support of parents/carers that we can achieve and sustain this.

Where possible please ensure your holiday and excursions take place during the school holidays.
