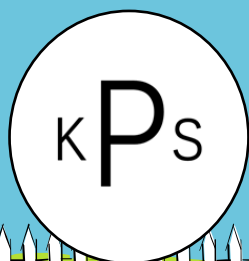
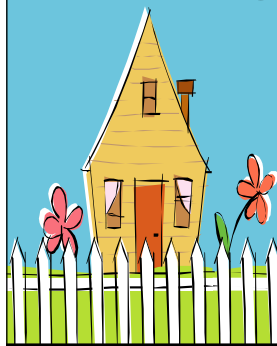

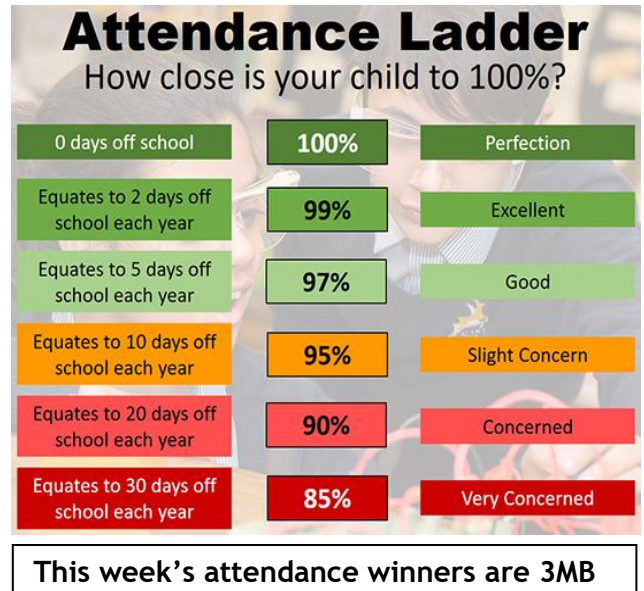
Attendance
