

Please ensure that your child is ready to begin their lesson 5 minutes before the lesson starts.

### In-school provision

I wanted to update families of children who are still attending school each day with details of what school actually looks like.

- Children are in bubbles of between 10 and 18. These bubbles have all been allocated a separate part of the school and a bubble space includes several classrooms and a hall/outside space. Children have their own playground space for breaks.
- The same staff work with the children every day and remain in that bubble.
- During the morning, children complete assigned work on *Google classroom* and, where possible, join in with the live lessons. Staff in school share the teaching input on the screen in the classroom, explain tasks and are available to support the children when completing their independent tasks. Children may complete their work online, on worksheets or in an exercise book.
- During the afternoon, children complete a mixture of topic work and PE. Their wellbeing and having fun are the main focuses.
- Lunchtimes and playtimes are as per a normal school day.

### School uniform

As we are trying to keep school looking as normal as possible for those in attendance, please ensure that your child is wearing school uniform.

### Faunce Street and cars

A reminder that we have an agreement in place with Southwark Council and local residents that we would limit the number of cars using Faunce Street. Additionally, cars are a danger to families leaving school and we want all families to feel safe during drop-off and collection. You will be aware that we have had staff standing at the end of the street to prevent this from happening and I will be looking to reintroduce this. **Please do not drive down or park on Faunce Street unless you live there.**

### Olympic rower assembly - message from teacher Josh

Keyworth Primary School is excited to announce that on the **27th January** we'll be hosting a PE assembly with **Ollie Cook**, who will be competing at this summer's **Olympic Games**. Keyworth will be taking part in a virtual celebration of Children's Mental Health Week from 1<sup>st</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> February 2021.

Activities throughout the week will include:
