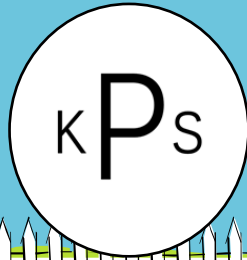

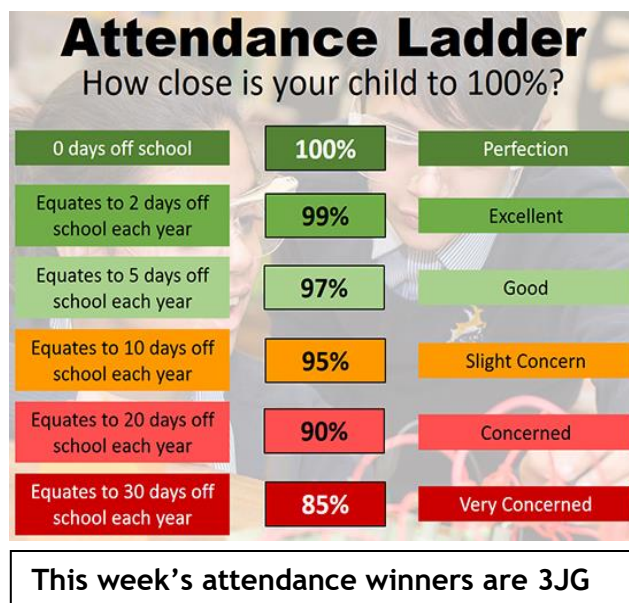
## Attendance

### International Women's Day

- **Florence Price** - in 1933, Florence became the first African-American woman to have her symphony performed by a major orchestra. She combined the traditions of classical music with the sound of spirituals and West African rhythms and dance from her culture.

- **Ibtihaj Muhammad** - at the Rio Olympics in 2016, Ibtihaj became the first Muslim-American athlete to wear a hijab and win a medal at the Olympic Games, winning a bronze in the team sabre event in the sport of fencing.

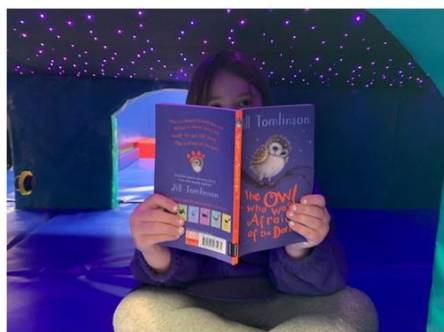
